Partnership is one of Springer's core values. While we often think of partnership as it applies to the relationships that are forged between students, parents, and teachers who work closely together to understand and address the students' learning disabilities, partnership at Springer takes other forms that are also critical to delivering our mission.

We are fortunate to have formed partnerships with other schools and school districts, Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center, the Cincinnati Museum Center, and the University of Cincinnati. Each of these partnerships is unique yet similar in its power to connect us to children and families in our community.

This October, for example, we will again join with the Family Resource Center of Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center to present an

evening of parent education. Richard Lavoie, a noted speaker, author, and educator will address "The Motivation Breakthrough – 6 Secrets to Turning On the Tuned-Out Child." Mr. Lavoie's presentation will speak to the needs of all parents who want to understand how to motivate their children. However, it will be especially beneficial to parents whose children are struggling in school. Matching motivation techniques to the child becomes ever more important for the child who has difficulty learning to read, write or do math. In addition to hearing Mr. Lavoie, for many parents it will be their first introduction to the wealth of resources available through the Family Resource Center and Springer.

Also, this fall we will enter our sixth year of partnering with the University of Cincinnati. C4C (Collaboration for Collaboration), as this partnership is named, refers to the collaborative effort between


UC and Springer to prepare teachers of today and tomorrow to meet the needs of all students. The 4 in C4C represents what Center Director, Barbara Hunter, calls the 'Big Four' learning systems. That refers to attention, language, memory, and the temporal and spatial ordering systems that are the underpinnings of all learning. Through the C4C partnership, UC and Springer have realized an impact on children and professionals that exceeds what either could have accomplished alone.

While teaching children remains at the heart of what we do at Springer, we are grateful for the opportunity to partner with others in our community to further understanding and education, and ultimately to improve the outcomes for children with learning disabilities.








Oliver Gale Washington Academy




