- Content area knowledge, experience designing lessons utilizing technology and strong classroom management skills.

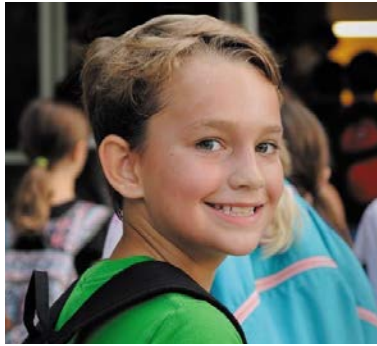
