Empowering young learners to reclaim confidence





At Springer, our dedicated faculty team creates learning plans and tracks progress with reading specialists, speech-language pathologists and occupational therapists to address each student's specific needs. Last year 189 Lower School and Middle School students benefitted from this specialized support, not possible in most traditional classrooms.

Ambor, a Springer parent, knows all too well how programming and tools are not equal across schools and classrooms. Diagnosed with dyslexia as an adult, Ambor recognized early on the signs in her oldest daughter, Kara. Ambor got to work researching dyslexia and getting Kara an IEP. However, the school district was not supportive. They eventually moved to Ohio, where dyslexia legislation was more advanced but, despite their best hopes, they experienced further challenges.

Through these struggles, Ambor learned about Springer.

Kara began at Springer in August of 2023, with her two younger siblings starting the following year. Springer is uniquely "able to find the holes and then place the students where they need to go. If they need more math, you put them in a place to meet them where they are." She applauds that "they are building off of strengths...this is something you can do that other teachers with bigger classes cannot do."

Through this journey, Ambor was inspired to study the science of learning and become a teacher so she can make a positive **impact** on children like her own who might not have an advocate. "My kids—they are amazing. They are still so persistent. Having them in an environment where you see them for who they are, not just a number—there is so much value in that. I don't see why we can't provide that for all students."





Making students feel seen







In August of 2023, Springer High School welcomed 14 students and 4 dedicated staff members to create its inaugural 9th grade class. With a learning environment designed to meet specific student needs and build upon individual strengths, and a community fostered through team-building activities, Springer High School is a place where students can be seen.

Allison's son, Carter, had always struggled academically. For years Allison was diligent, seeking diagnoses, requesting individualized instruction and monitoring Carter's required classroom accommodations. It was like a second full-time job. However, despite her best efforts, their school district was unable to meet his needs. Midway through 7th grade Allison made the difficult decision to pull and homeschool Carter.

When it became time to look for a high school, Allison was strategic and thoughtful, searching for a program that would be able to support Carter in his learning and help him regain the confidence he had lost across the years. During this search, someone recommended Springer's new high school program.

Allison calls the experience lifechanging. Carter was "like a different human. Family and friends were shocked by the

transformation". This was the Carter that Allison saw in past summers, when he was not stressed about school. At Springer, Carter was surrounded by students like him. Although each student may face different challenges, they all understand what it is like to learn differently and need extra support. Allison reflects on how Carter's relationship with school has changed at Springer: "He doesn't feel isolated...he has friends, a support system, and he feels comfortable communicating with his teachers. It has been lifechanging for him."

In September 2023, the Springer Board of Trustees unanimously voted to move the high school program forward and continue making an **impact** on learners beyond grade 8.

Providing long-awaited answers





As awareness for learning disabilities has grown, we considered how we could increase our impact. The new Springer Diagnostic Center began welcoming families for diagnostic evaluations in 2023.

The Lund Family was referred to Springer by their daughter's school. After researching multiple options, they felt that Springer was the right choice and reached out to schedule a psycho-educational assessment. "I was able to understand exactly what the assessment would entail, pricing was very clear, and the communication cadence let me know that Springer valued our family and was a place that was very caring and kid-focused."

After a complete diagnostic evaluation, the family felt a sense of relief:

"We could understand our daughter's strengths and challenges better.

For her, it allowed her to put a name to what she's been feeling for so long". The evaluation and guidance from our diagnostic team, comprised of psychologists, speech-language pathologists and occupational therapists, provided the family with supportive strategies and a formal diagnosis to support accommodations at their daughter's school.

Mrs. Lund reflects on the evaluation process: "It opened the door to better communication in our home. It is very

difficult to know what is going on inside your child's mind, and the evaluation results allowed us insight into things she couldn't verbally communicate. Now that we have more information, we can develop strategies both at home and at school to help her succeed."

With 77 evaluations completed in its first year, that many families now have answers and guidance to help their learners reclaim a path to success. Just as with our Lower School, Middle School and High School, financial aid is available to help more families get the services and the answers they need to move forward. Additionally, 96 families have utilized tutoring services through 863 sessions and 80 more students participated in our well-established summer learning program. Springer Diagnostic Center is making an impact.





Empowering educators and parents





As the leading tri-state educational provider for students who learn differently, we feel a responsibility to share our knowledge with the community.

Local teacher Heidi Gallagher found that students were coming to her third-grade classroom below grade level in reading and writing. As a Springer parent, she recognized the struggle and understood the potential of the Wilson Reading System® to positively impact her students: "Wilson and Fundations are both research-based programs proven to be effective for all types of learners, especially those with learning difficulties."

After participating in the full program, Heidi implemented the strategies into her third-grade curriculum to great success: "Gaps were closed and the confidence in my students was boosted. I would not have felt comfortable using this program if it wasn't for the training I received from the Springer Learning Center. By integrating the program I was able to provide students with the tools they needed to become confident, skilled readers and writers."

In Heidi's case, she also hoped to help her own child: "I wanted to know how I could help my daughter at home with her reading and writing. It is important to be consistent with verbiage at school and at home." Heidi recommends the program to fellow parents of children with learning difficulties: "Knowing how the program works...can only increase the reading and writing success of the child."

Springer Learning Center creates exceptional programming to extend our reach and positively impact more families by giving educators, parents and caregivers training to better support the young learners in their lives.


