Consultation with a psychologist	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Record Review (Review of IEPs, ETRs, psychological evaluations to help you make sense of the data)</li> <li>90-minute meeting with a psychologist</li> </ul>
IQ Test	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>IQ assessment</li> <li>30-minute feedback session with the psychologist</li> </ul>
Comprehensive Evaluation (ADHD, Learning disabilities, Mood/behavioral disorders)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Record Review (Review of IEPs, ETRs, psychological evaluations)</li> <li>90-minute consultation with a psychologist, including a clinical interview</li> <li>Standardized testing with the psychologist</li> <li>Standardized testing with an occupational therapist and/or speech-language pathologist as needed.</li> <li>Rating scales for parents, teachers, and possibly the child</li> <li>90-minute feedback session with the psychologist</li> <li>Psychologist attendance at a school team meeting to help relay results</li> </ul>
College-Bound Evaluation (for clients needing updated scores to qualify for accommodations)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>IQ assessment</li> <li>Achievement assessments</li> <li>60-minute feedback session with the psychologist</li> </ul>
Independent Educational Evaluation (IEE)	<p>Assessments of a child's educational needs, abilities, and performance conducted by a qualified examiner who is not employed by the school district responsible for the student's education. Under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), parents have the right to request an IEE at public expense if they disagree with a school district's evaluation of their child. The purpose of an IEE is to provide an objective evaluation to help determine appropriate educational services, supports, or eligibility for special education. The results of an IEE must be considered by the school district in decision-making regarding the student's educational program</p>
Testing with a Speech-Language Pathologist or Occupational Therapist (no psychologist)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>30-minute consultation with the speech-language pathologist or occupational therapist</li> <li>Standardized testing</li> <li>60-minute feedback session</li> </ul>
